FLOWER SECTION

Please note: exhibits to be named where possible.

**Medals will be awarded (POSITIONS 1ST TO 3RD) to the exhibitor
gaining the greatest number of points in classes 1-5**

1. One vase of annuals, one kind, five stems
2. One vase of perennials, one kind, five stems
3. A foliage pot plant, up to 20cm (8in pot)
4. A flowering pot plant, up to 20cm (8in pot)
5. One vase of mixed flowering shrubs (not less than three varieties)

*Vase neck to not exceed 10cm (4in) in diameter

FRUIT & VEGETABLE SECTION

Medals will be awarded (POSITIONS 1ST TO 3RD) to the exhibitor gaining the greatest number of points in classes 1-19

6. Three courgettes, with or without flowers
7. Runner beans, six pods
8. Three onions, their tops dressed
9. Soft fruits, one variety, one dish of no more than 12 items
10. Tomatoes, a plate of 4, any variety with calyces
11. Dish or plate of four potatoes (any variety)
12. Collection of four herbs for culinary use, cut and displayed
13. French beans, six pods
14. Edible flowers
15. Five carrots of one variety, 7.5cm (3in) tops trimmed
16. Any other kind of vegetable not mentioned, in reasonable quantity, e.g. a pair of marrows, six pea pods etc
17. Cucumber, one pair with or without flowers
18. Collection of vegetables (not less than three kinds) on a tray or in a basket (not to exceed 46cm x 61cm (18x24in))
19. Most humorous vegetable or fruit

NOTES FOR EXHIBITORS & JUDGES

See also pages 9-10 for entry rules

- Flowering stems can be taken from any flowering plant
- Only fresh homegrown flowers can be used
- A vase is a vessel that can be used to hold cut flowers and which is taller than it is wide at its widest part
- When points are awarded, they should be clearly marked by the judges on the exhibitors' cards
- Any queries that may arise regarding anything other than the above rules should be referred to, and decided by the show officials

**FAILURE TO ABIDE BY THESE RULES WILL LEAD TO
DISQUALIFICATION**

HANDICRAFTS

20. A piece of origami folded from a single sheet of paper
21. A hand knitted toy – the judge will consider safety first, together with play value
22. A hand-crafted paper Christmas card with an envelope
23. A decorated hand made wooden nesting box – max base size 15cm x 15cm (6in x 6in)
24. A patchwork cushion to a max size of 45cm x 45cm (18in x 18in)

COOKERY

**Where sizes are stated, they must be adhered to
NO fresh cream to be used in displayed items please**

ALL exhibits to be covered with cling film

Baked goods can be brought in on the day from 8.30am-10.00am

25. A Victoria sandwich, made using 3eggs with a raspberry jam filling
26. A loaf of bread baked in a loaf tin
27. Four decorated cupcakes, showing two complimentary designs, exhibited on a suitable container covered with clingfilm. (Judging will be largely based on decoration)
28. Fruit tart made with sweet pastry and a lattice top
29. Cake made using fruit or vegetables (please state for judging purposes the fruit or vegetables used) Points will be awarded for originality in this class

JAMS & PRESERVES

30. Jar of jam made from berry fruit
31. Jar of marmalade
32. Jar of curd
33. Jar of chutney – any variety, hot or spicy to be stated on label

All jars to be dated and have new lids, or wax discs and film lids

CHILDRENS CLASSES

No entry fee charged for children

School Year 3 or below at end of Summer Term 2026 (including pre-school children)

34. Two decorated cupcakes in a suitable container covered in clingfilm
35. A playdough/clay/plasticine animal
36. A painting or drawing of their choosing (no larger than a4)
37. A garden on a paper plate

School Year 4 to 6 at end of Summer Term 2026

38. Two decorated cupcakes in a suitable container covered in clingfilm
39. Two paper cup animals
40. A 3d model of their choosing (max size 30cm tall)
41. A painting of their hero

RULES & REGULATIONS

1. All exhibits must have been grown in the competitors own garden or allotment for at least 2 months prior to the Show date. In the handicraft section items should have been created in the last two years
2. The organisers reserve the right to refuse entry & their decision relating to disqualification of any entry, the award of medals will be final
3. Entry forms must be received no later than time and date stated on the entry form
4. Entry to classes is £2 (except children's which is free)
5. If there are less than 4 entries in a class then 2nd & 3rd certificate may be withheld
6. All exhibits should be staged from 8.30am-10am on Sunday 23rd August
7. Judging will take place from 10.30am and the exhibition area will be open to the public when judging has finished
8. Awards will take place from 4.30pm on 23rd August
9. At 5pm exhibitors may remove their exhibits
10. All exhibits must be removed by 6pm. Any left after this time will be disposed of
11. A judge may recommend that a 1st place will not be awarded where there are only 2 entries
12. Competitors may only exhibit **ONE** entry per class
13. Competitors shall supply their own vases and bowls.
14. Objection to any exhibit must be made in writing to the Community Association before 2pm on show day
15. The organisers will not be responsible for the loss of any exhibit, or for any damage it may sustain, but every care will be taken of exhibits

- 16.No cards other than those issued by the organisers may be placed on any exhibit, except for the names of varieties where required.
- 17.Infringement of any of the rules may be penalised by forfeiture of any prizes awarded
- 18.**All classes:** exhibitors must comply with all instructions and given dimensions when stated within individual classes. When stated sizes are given, they must be adhered to
